### **Oman Renaissance subsidiary wins USD 100m EPC contract in UAE**

Topaz Engineering, a subsidiary of Oman's Renaissance Services (MSM:RNSS), has won an OMR 38.5 million (USD 100m/EUR 71.9m) engineering, procurement and construction (EPC) contract from UAE-based GPSCemoil for the construction of an oil storage terminal in the Fujairah emirate, UAE.

The contract was awarded to Nico International Hydrospace, a strategic business unit of Topaz Engineering, by GPSCemoil, a partnership between UAE-based Gulf Petrol Supplies LLC (GPS) and Singapore's Chemoil.

The 580,000 cu m (20.483 million cu ft) terminal is one of the largest EPC tank terminal projects awarded to Topaz Engineering recently in terms of project value and terminal size. The fully automated storage terminal is equipped with a facility for loading and receiving middle distillates, gas and fuel oil from shipping berths at OT1 and OT2 via eight loading and receiving pipelines running from the jetties to the terminal.

The scope of work, which is expected to take almost two years to complete, includes complete engineering, procurement of all materials, tanks and critical equipment, and the construction of the entire tank farm. Work will also extend to commissioning and hook up to the existing facilities of the Port of Fujairah and the GPS terminal.
